	In this session we will give a steel industry update. We will discuss global and domestic supply and demand. Current and forward looking market conditions. We will discuss market segments such as: construction, energy, automotive, heavy equipment, agriculture and transportation with a focus on construction.		
9:15-10:15 am	Bow String Truss Repair and the Duration of Load Factor that is Affecting these Trusses Paul Gilham, P.E., S.E., Chief Engineer, Western Wood Structures, Inc.		
	Timber trusses in general and bowstring trusses specifically were widely used methods of providing long clear span spaces in the 1920s through the 1960s. Bowstring trusses designs were optimized to conform to the state of the science at the time they were designed. However, several aspects of the state of the science of this era have been found to be far too aggressive to the point that these trusses are significantly overstressed using today's code requirements.		
	Rehabilitating these members requires a thorough understanding of truss behavior, accurate analysis of the truss and an understanding of historic lumber grading rules and duration of load effects. Repair designs must appropriately address all deficiencies found in the analysis.		
	This presentation will address the issues that result in bowstring trusses being overstressed and why these trusses fail, "for no apparent reason." Additionally, repair and upgrade procedures, both appropriate and inappropriate, will be examined.

1:00-2:00 pm	The Mass Timber Revolution Dustin Willms, P.Eng., Senior Project Manager, Fast + Epp Structural Engineers, Mass timber represents a rapidly advancing technology that can be utilized as an alternative to steel and concrete for both prefabricated structures and structures built on site. This session will provide a general overview of mass timber: pros and cons, motivations for its use, material categories and definitions, and project examples with lessons learned. Topics of discussion will include delivery, suppliers, weather protection erection speed, preplanning, building equipment coordination, and damaged panel remediation. The state of the mass timber industry in North America and Europe will be highlighted, and current trends and predictions for the future will be shared.
